- Make sure your mover is an AMSA-certified ProMover® if you are moving locally or long distance; or an AMSA-certified Registered International Mover® (RIM) with an IAM MX Validation® if you are moving overseas.
- Judge the company's professional appearance. Ensure they have an actual street address and check their standing with the Better Business Bureau.
- Beware of unusually low pricing; it's often a red flag for hidden fees and potential moving scams.
- Ask about the company's claims policy, process, and ratio (the number of claims versus the number of moves conducted). Expect detailed answers.
- Ask for customer references that you can check. A reputable moving company should be able to provide them on the spot.
